Sports Premium Impact 2016 to 2017

The government provided additional funding to improve provision of physical education (P.E.) and sport in primary schools. This funding was provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport.

For the academic year 2016 – 2017 Batheaston Primary School has received **£8712**

- ✚ A P.E. Co-ordinator was funded. She lead and reviewed PE across the school providing and facilitating CPD opportunities for teachers. This raised teacher confidence, knowledge and skills (see detailed questionnaire results); enabled teachers to target their P.E. provision for vulnerable groups and provide high quality P.E. provision. She also ran a bespoke FUNActive club which targeted less active children and raised their awareness of the importance of being active and eating healthily. The PE coordinator facilitated and supported the training of Sport Leaders and Play Leaders who initiated physically active games during break times; organised and promoted Huff and Puff activities; lead School Games competitions and intra-house events. Significant work was completed last year to raise the profile of physical activity in our school including the addition of new events; in-class initiatives; stronger links with community clubs and the use of our unique grounds to support physical activity levels across all curriculum subjects. Children at Batheaston Primary School are now more physically active than 2015/16 due to the high profile of physical activity and PE. in our school (see questionnaire results).
- ✚ An experienced School Sports partnership organiser was funded to lead cluster sports events, provide training for teachers, identify and support Gifted and Talented children and offer specialist advice and opportunities for children and staff. Identified children attended bespoke training sessions and developed their leadership and sporting skills in school.
- ✚ A specialist coach was employed through the Superstars Sports Agency to teach all children in the school. This has raised the profile and enjoyment of PE (see pupil questionnaire results for a detailed analysis)
- ✚ Transport for all children to a minimum of one sporting competition and/ or sport festival in school time (e.g. bus and staff to take teams to cluster competitions) was funded. All children attended a minimum of one sports festival with other local schools. Many children attended more than one.
- ✚ Equipment and resources were purchased to enhance the quality of P.E. and Huff and Puff provision. This included equipment to improve safety during lessons e.g. new gymnastic mats, softer, lighter balls.
- ✚ In recognition of some of the above the school was awarded the Silver School Games Award.
