What should I already know?

- Different methods for **printing** including using potatoes, everyday objects and making our own stamps
- How to make **symmetrical pulled pictures** using paint and paper
- How different materials can be used to make a **collage** picture

Human features Things that are made by humans such as cities, roads, buildings	Physical features This that occur naturally such as mountains, rivers.	Germination How a plant develops from a seed
Beach A pebble or sandy shore at the coast	Cliff A steep rock face usually by the sea	Deciduous Trees that lose their leaves in winter
Town A settlement that is larger than a village but smaller than a city	Coast Where the land and the sea join	Evergreen Trees that do not lose their leaves during winter
Village A small rural settlement	City A large or important town	Seed Developing plant in a case
Rural Countryside location	Urban A town or city location	Seasonal Changing with the seasons
