Over 200 years ago in Germany, the Brothers Grimm wrote down the very first traditional tales. They heard them from storytellers all over Europe.

### Key Questions and Lesson focus

#### Jack and the Beanstalk

Create character descriptions using information from the story. Learn about the life cycle of a bean. Depict it's growth in sequence. *Learn about life in a castle through Medieval history.*

#### Goldilocks and the 3 Bears

Recall key facts from the story. Think about the setting, characters and plot. Write a recount of the story, using the key facts.



#### The Three Little Pigs

Read the alternative story about the 'Three Little Wolves' Design a new home for the 3 pigs. *Use a range of materials to build with, test ideas and evaluate their designs.*

#### Little Red Riding Hood

Re-tell the story using a story map. Include the setting, main events in the plot and key characters. *Create maps of their house, garden or where they live.*



#### The Tortoise and the Hare

Use a story board to sequence the main events in the story. Re-create a racecourse add labels and elements within the setting.

#### The Gingerbread Man

Make gingerbread biscuits. Look at the main ingredients. What are the spices? What would happen to the biscuit if it fell into water?



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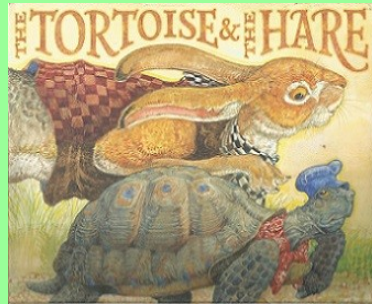
